## Guidance Notes for Visitors

### Dress Code

Please ensure that all your party are familiar with the Club Dress Code

### Overall Guidelines

- ◆ The Club has a standard of “smart casual” dress at all times.
- ◆ Blue denim jeans, tracksuits, paramilitary clothing, cargo shorts, trainers, rugby/football shirts or beach wear are **not acceptable** at any time.

### On the Course

- ◆ Recognised golf attire is as dictated by fashion and convention for both men and ladies.
- ◆ Short socks should be white, when worn with shorts.
- ◆ Unless fitted and designed to be worn loose, shirts must be tucked in.
- ◆ Bare midriffs are not acceptable.

### In the Clubhouse

- ◆ It is not necessary to change for lunch, provided that clothes are clean and dry.
- ◆ Golf headwear and wet gear should not be worn in the lounge or dining room.
- ◆ In the Dining Room after 7pm, men should wear jacket and tie and the appropriate equivalent for ladies.

Staff members have been given strict instructions to address all breaches of the dress code and to request visitors to rectify/change immediately.

**Thank you for your co-operation in helping us maintain a minimum set of standards at the club.**

### Handicaps

- ◆ Gentlemen visitors are expected to have handicaps of 28 or less, ladies 36 or less. The Club reserves the right to remove anyone from the course who does not meet the required standard of play.

### Etiquette

- ◆ Visitors are expected to conform to established golfing etiquette and be aware of other players.
- ◆ Out of consideration for other golfers, **a round should not exceed 3½ hours.**
- ◆ **Audible use of mobile phones is prohibited on the course and in the Clubhouse (including the terrace and areas around the putting green and practice nets).** Mobile phones must not be allowed to ring or make any other sound in these areas although use in silent mode is permitted. Visitors wishing to take incoming calls or make outgoing calls may only do so in the car park.

## Clubhouse and Car Park

- ◆ Access to the locker rooms is via security doors, which are opened using a numeric code. The code is changed on a daily basis and will be given to the organiser on the day of your visit.
- ◆ Towels are available, but visitors are encouraged to bring their own as supplies cannot be guaranteed.
- ◆ The Clubhouse closes at 10.30 p.m. If taxis are required, these should be booked before dinner. A payphone can be found in the hallway.
- ◆ In the interests of security, please ensure your car is locked at all times and valuables are kept out of sight.

## Trolleys & Buggies

- ◆ Pull or electric trolleys are acceptable (unless a trolley ban is in operation due to adverse weather and ground conditions) and are available for hire from the Professional's Shop.
- ◆ A small number of golf buggies are available for hire; you are advised to book early via the Professional's Shop.
- ◆ Golfers are advised not to leave their bags or trolleys unattended.

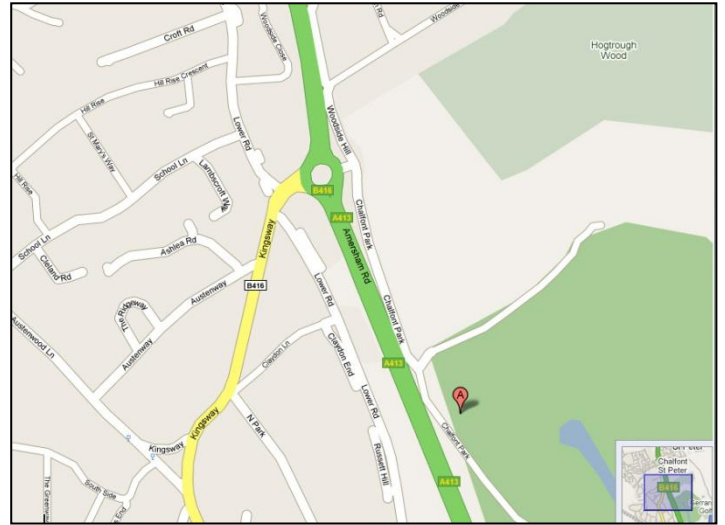
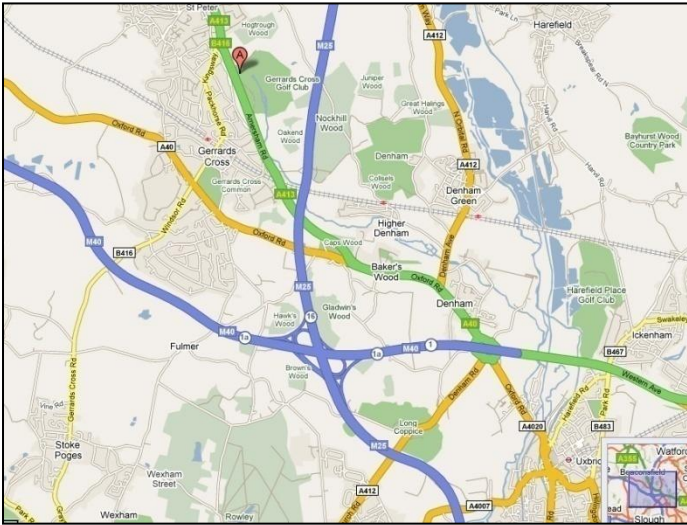

## M25 travelling North

Junction 16 – M40 east (SECOND turning) to Uxbridge, London  
M40 Junction 1 – A40 left to Gerrards Cross, Beaconsfield  
Second traffic lights – right onto A413, The Chalfonts  
First roundabout – right, then right again to the Golf Club

## M25 travelling South

Junction 16 – M40 east (FIRST turning) to Uxbridge, London  
M40 Junction 1 – A40 left to Gerrards Cross, Beaconsfield  
Second traffic lights – right onto A413, The Chalfonts  
First roundabout – right, then right again to the Golf Club.

## M40 travelling East

Junction 1 – A40 left to Gerrards Cross, Beaconsfield  
Second traffic lights – right onto A413, The Chalfonts  
First roundabout – right, then right again to the Golf Club.

## A40 travelling West

M40 Junction 1 – left to the A40. Keep off the M40.  
Denham roundabout – A40 to Gerrards Cross / Beaconsfield  
Second traffic lights – right onto A413, The Chalfonts  
First roundabout – right, then right again to the Golf Club

## A40 travelling East

From Beaconsfield – A40 east to Gerrards Cross  
'Welcome to Gerrards Cross' sign on left  
First traffic lights – left to Gerrards Cross centre  
Straight along Packorse Road and Kingsway, about 1 mile  
First roundabout – straight on, then right to the Golf Club
